Puck and Moyamoya is a story to be read aloud for children aged from 4 to 10 years. The story should be read in its entirety. So please take the time for this story. Read it in a quiet environment, so that the story can be continued whenever the child wants to continue reading. Please read it anytime except before bedtime, because then your child may be pondering on the problem and have difficulties falling asleep.

The book is also suitable as a reading story at school to discuss the issues in question in a group.

In the back of the book you will find an explanation for parents, doctors, teachers and care professionals about the psychology behind the story.

Therapeutic books have proved to be a useful tool in helping children and their parents to process their emotions.
